Clear Perception for Coming Days: Lent 2025

Perception is the way we take in and "become aware"* of things around us. Perception is one part of a bigger process of meaning-making, as we tie meaning and value to objects, people, places, and experiences. This Lent we will engage in a journey of faith that seeks awareness and daily perception of God's grace and peace. In a world of sound bites, memes, deep fakes, and AI confusion, I believe we are being called to be people who perceive the world around us with wisdom, clarity, and truth that is centered on God's word-to-us, our Lord Jesus Christ.

This Lent our emphasis on perception will be inspired by the book, Lent in Plain Sight: A Devotion through Ten Objects by Rev. Dr. Jill Duffield**. Each week in worship, we'll explore ties from objects in scripture to objects we might see and perceive in our own daily experience. Some worship themes will differ slightly from book themes due to the scripture of the day, but I invite and encourage you to seek out Lent in Plain Sight as your own devotional reading this Lenten season. As of February 24th, the book is on sale through the PCUSA online store***, linked in the notes below.

If there was ever a time in our technological history as humans, or a time in our society's modern history when clear perception was needed, I feel those days might be these days. Let us journey together as a church family, seeking hope, peace, justice, and truth this Lent.

Session Work Summary - February 2025

Your Westminster Session would like to share the following summary of the February 11th called meeting. Pastor Chris began the meeting with the regular agenda item "Being Disciples, Being Leaders" in which he shared the story of Jack Edwards, a senator from Alabama first elected in 1965. Pastor Chris knew Edwards as a Presbyterian choir member in his 80's who regretted some of his stances taken earlier in his political career. Edwards shared that senators during his tenure didn't always vote together across the aisle but they would work together. They practiced civility and found real answers through compromise and cooperation. Edwards exhibited two outstanding traits: amicable leadership and openness to growth and new perspectives. Pastor Chris shared his hope that Session can also show these traits in our work, while having a faith that seeks understanding.

Elder Jaime Hemmerling, moderator of Stewardship & Finance, distributed copies of the proposed 2025 budget vs the approved and actual 2024 budget. A non-balanced budget will be presented at the Annual congregational meeting. No cost of living adjustments are being given to staff. Building & Grounds expenses are primarily due to the increased insurance cost. The Stewardship & Finance committee will be considering various cost cutting measures, but this will not affect the 2025 budget. Increased revenue is needed. Session voted to approve the proposed 2025 budget.

Two action items were approved by Session. The ministries of Mission & Social Witness, Communication & Outreach, Presbyterian Women, and the Matthew 25 Church representative recommend:

1. Reaffirmation of our covenant with Covenant Network of Presbyterians:

• To ENGAGE the church to invite all of God's children into safe and welcoming congregational spaces of affirmation, healing, dignity and purpose.

• To EDUCATE the church to expand our welcome of LGBTQIA+ people, to affirm their gifts of ordained office, and uphold marriage equality for all.

• To EQUIP the church to bear witness to justice through advocacy and activism at the international, national and local church levels, speaking a prophetic word in anxious and divided times; and standing with others fighting hate and oppression against any of God's children.

2. Session release the following statement due to current events in our nation:

"At Westminster Presbyterian Church Lincoln, we are dedicated to loving and welcoming all. We support those in need and suffering to the best of our abilities, as Jesus Christ calls us to do in Matthew 25:35-36.

We advocate for justice, as inspired by Isaiah 1:17."

The Future Missional Model subcommittee has identified three potential church consultants for guidance to focus our mission for the future while managing financial concerns and declining membership. The goal is to recommend one to Session at the March meeting.

Westminster Food Pantry News

In 1992, 33 years ago the Westminster Food Pantry was established. It has been a very successful mission of our church under the supervision of the Outreach Committee. So many of you have helped with the pantry and many have asked questions. Our pantry works with the People City Mission and they provide us with a list of approximately 270 items that are packed each week. Our members contribute to the project and bring donations to the church office and put in the large wooden box. However, this isn't nearly enough food to meet our needs so we shop and spend approximately \$1000 a month purchasing groceries. We are so thankful for the monetary gifts which enables us to buy the needed items. These groceries are brought to the church usually on a Sunday morning and we are thankful for people who have helped unload the car. Then the shelves are stocked and ready for the packers. We provide boxes of food for one family of four, two families of three and three families of two. On Monday morning, a man from the mission picks up our boxes and the mission distributes the food. We have thirteen teams of packers and they pack once every three months. These packers are Bob and Sheri Michaud, Marilyn Smith and Nora Hinrichs, Stacey and Colton Graham, Pat Ryan, Tom and Janelle Welstead, Kevin and Beth Anne Bryson and family, Fred and Susan Zander, Pat Hackley and Ben Kessler, Martha Kingsbury, Bruce and Margaret Sheffield, Bill and Gretchen Stelzer and family, David and Kathy Anderson and Jim and Carol Bishop. Marilyn Smith and Nora Hinrichs are the coordinators for the pantry. I know many others have helped in the past and we are so appreciative of the help. The pantry is located next to the nursery and you are always welcome to stop by and visit. For 33 years you have provided groceries, volunteered and financially supported this wonderful mission. If you are interested in helping with the pantry, please let the church know. Hopefully this mission can continue for many, many more years. Thank you.

Glenna Haller Represents PW at the United Nations

Westminster member, Glenna Haller, will have the opportunity and privilege to represent Presbyterian Women (PW) as a delegate to the 69th session of the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) March 10-21 in New York City. In 2018, Presbyterian Women received accreditation to the CSW with voice and vote thus strengthening the partnership between PW and the PC(USA) and enhancing Presbyterian visibility at the UN. During the Commission's annual two-week session, representatives will gather to discuss the progress and gaps in the implementation of the 1995 Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, the key global policy document on gender equality created 30 years ago, as well as learn about emerging issues that affect gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls. The outcomes and concrete recommendations for action will then be forwarded to the UN Economic and Social Council. Many side events bring global women together to provide additional opportunities for advocacy, information exchange, and networking. Westminster members can support Glenna with prayer and by attending her commissioning in the worship service on March 2.

Report of Westminster Foundation for Calendar Year 2024

Westminster Foundation met in February, April, June, August, October, and December 2024. As of December 31, 2024, Westminster Foundation had assets totaling \$3,849,740.76 spread over 31 different endowed funds and other accounts. During the 2024 year, Foundation provided \$132,495.86 to Westminster Presbyterian Church from the following funds:

Anderson Music Fund, Bacon Music Endowment, Bukey Memorial Fund, Christian Education Fund, General Purpose Fund, Knox Family Endowment, Major Event Endowment, Mission Endowment, Youth Mission Endowment, Nissen Youth Ministry Endowment.

These funds provided general budgetary support as well as support for special projects like the Service of Service for Lincoln Hygiene Network, completion of the parking lot and sidewalk repairs, a November speaker series featuring Rev. Dr. Bruce Reyes-Chow, support for the Youth Mission Trip, and a remodel and refurbishment of the Youth Room Space.

The Foundation received \$13,549.30 in contributions from donors in 2024 to the following funds: Christian Education, Facilities, General Purpose, Great Commission, Mission, Organ Maintenance, Choir/Music/Radio/TV ministry endowment

The Foundation continues to faithfully financially support Westminster Presbyterian Church. Cause and Effect

But the damage is much worse where there are no funds for adaptation or where conditions make escape necessary—picture migration caused by famine or islands overcome by sea rise.

What can we do about it?
