Today's Prelude and Postlude are offered in celebration of Woman Composer Sunday, an annual event inaugurated in 2021 by the Society of Woman Organists and Royal College of Organists.

Today's words for worship, or "liturgy," are adapted from the resource *Feasting on the Word Worship Companion: Liturgies for Year C, Volume 1.*, Rev. Dr. Kimberly Bracken Long, editor. Dr. Long is currently the editor of *Call to Worship: Liturgy, Music, Preaching, and the Arts*, the PCUSA's liturgy journal. She is an ordained PC(USA) minister and served as professor of sacramental and liturgical worship at Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, GA. (A Fun Fact since you've read this far:, Pastor Chris took an elective course on Occasional Services in our tradition taught by Dr. Long while a student at Columbia.) Scripture references in our liturgy are from Feasting on the Word and from the day's Common Revised Lectionary readings.

God is often at work through the ordinary: ordinary people, ordinary objects, ordinary grace. Through the ordinary, God communicates epiphanies, salvation, revelation, and reconciliation. It is through the mundane that we hear God's quiet voice.

This Lent at Westminster, we will explore God in ordinary objects found in scripture, both in worship and through the reading of *Lent in Plain Sight* by Rev. Dr. Jill Duffield.

From the Publisher:

In this devotional for the season of Lent, Jill J. Duffield draws readers' attention to ten ordinary objects that Jesus would have encountered on his way to Jerusalem: dust, bread, the cross, coins, shoes, oil, coats, towels, thorns, and stones. In each object, readers will find meaning in the biblical account of Jesus' final days. Each week, readers encounter a new object to consider

through Scripture, prayer, and reflection. From Ash Wednesday to Easter, *Lent in Plain Sight* reminds Christians to open ourselves to the kingdom of God.

Prairie Readers


