



Today's words for worship, or "liturgy," are adapted from the resource *Feasting on the Word Worship Companion: Liturgies for Year C, Volume 1.*, Rev. Dr. Kimberly Bracken Long, editor. Dr. Long is currently the editor of *Call to Worship: Liturgy, Music, Preaching, and the Arts*, the PCUSA's liturgy journal. She is an ordained PC(USA) minister and served as Professor of Sacramental and Liturgical Worship at Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, GA. Scripture references in our liturgy are from Feasting on the Word and from the day's Revised Common Lectionary readings. The Prayer of Confession was written by Pastor Chris to reflect themes in the John scripture reading.

### **TLC for Cone Flower Seeds**

Thank you everyone for your enthusiastic response to our call for help in starting Westminster's new native flower garden—so enthusiastic that we ran out of pots! Here's a little information to help you with plant care going forward. If possible, keep your plant in a sunny window. Put a saucer under the pot—it's porous! Keep the soil slightly moist, but don't let the pot stand in water. Germination will take 10-21 days. Keep us updated on the emergence and growth of your seedlings so we can decide on a favorable date for bringing them back to church. Talking to plants is fun for us and maybe also for the plants. Thank them and tell them about the garden we're preparing for them!
