Reminders from Presbyterians for Earth Care and Green@Heart:

Water is in the news. Some areas of our country have too much water, and we have seen the terrible, devastating, and deadly flooding that results. Some areas of our country have too little water, and we bear witness to drought and fires sparked by lightning, like the fires decimating the Grand Canyon's North Rim.

Water is also a part of our theology. Water is at our beginnings as people of faith, out of the watery chaos, God formed all of creation, and "a wind from God swept over the face of the waters" (Gen. 1:2). At the very beginning of our scriptures, water takes on beautiful and significant parts of our understanding of God, creation, and our role as stewards of our world. How can I reduce my water usage?

Bathroom: Shorten showers— Each minute saved in the shower can significantly reduce water usage.

Kitchen: Run full loads – Only operate dishwasher when full.

Outdoors: Use a broom instead of a hose – Clean driveways and sidewalks with a broom instead of hosing them down.
