September tips from Presbyterians for Earth Care and Green@Heart:

Food Waste, Food Labels, and Composting

In the U.S., nearly 120 million pounds of food are wasted annually—about 40% of the nation's food supply, or 325 pounds per person. Suggestions for avoiding unnecessary waste:

- 1. <u>Plan Your Meals and Make a List</u>: Inventory check Review what you already have in your fridge, freezer, and pantry to avoid buying duplicates.
- 2. <u>Buy only what you need</u>: Consider frequency Opt for frequent, smaller trips for fresh produce to avoid spoilage.
- 3. Other helpful tip: Storage matters properly store your groceries to extend their shelf life and prevent spoilage.
