Bed Build Project opportunity

The Mission and Social Witness Committee is hoping to conduct a bed-build at Westminster next year in conjunction with Sleep in Heavenly Peace. It involves an assembly-line process in the church parking lot which will result in 20 beds being built for children in Lincoln who have no beds. SHP provides the materials and tools and team members who supervise various stations with volunteers doing specific tasks such as measuring, drilling, assembly and staining. Completed beds are stored by SHP and delivered to families in need by special volunteer teams. Volunteers in their 90's have participated in SHP bed builds. No special skill or experience is needed. Youth are usually also involved.

St. Mark's United Methodist Church is doing a 140-bed build on Sept. 28 which has been opened up to the public to help fill 2 hour time slots. This is an opportunity for you to be involved in a bed build in advance of Westminster possibly conducting one next year. Some of our members have already participated in a bed build earlier this year. September tips from Presbyterians for Earth Care and Green@Heart: Food Waste, Food Labels, and Composting

In the U.S., nearly 120 million pounds of food are wasted annually—about 40% of the nation's food supply, or 325 pounds per person. Suggestions for avoiding unnecessary waste:

- 1. <u>Plan Your Meals and Make a List</u>: Create a targeted list Based on your meal plan, create a detailed grocery list with specific quantities to avoid impulse buys and overbuying.
- 2. <u>Buy only what you need</u>: Imperfect produce Don't hesitate to buy "ugly" fruits and vegetables, as they are often just as nutritious and can be cheaper.
- 3. Other helpful tip: Consider local and seasonal Buying local and seasonal produce can reduce food waste by shortening the distance food travels.
