

Stephanie Sorge, Pastor, Trinity Presbyterian Church, Harrisonburg, Virginia The Affirmation of Faith is from The PC(USA)'s *Brief Statement of Faith*, a confession of faith written for the time of reunification of the northern and southern main branches of Presbyterianism, which formed the PC(USA). It was adopted into the *Book of Confessions* in 1991.

October 12 "Joan of Arc: Her Life and Afterlife"

Presented by Dr. Carole Levin, UNL History Professor Emerita

Joan of Arc is one of the most famous people of the 15th century and one of the most famous women in history. A peasant girl who grew up in France during the 100 Years War with England, in 1429 she heard the voices of saints, who told her to ask the dauphin (the king's eldest son) for an army. In attempting to retake Paris, Joan was captured and tried by the English for witchcraft and sorcery. In 1431, she was burned at the stake, and in 1920 she was canonized. This talk discusses Joan's life and her image and reputation in the centuries after her death.

October tips from Presbyterians for Earth Care and Green@Heart: Eco-friendly Celebrations and Traditions in a Season of Giving

We are a consumer-driven society and oftentimes, in our attempts to celebrate with decorations, parties, and gifts, we damage, even desecrate, creation. As we conscientiously

work to conserve natural resources by using eco-friendly products, sustainable and local foods, we use less water, impose less on our land, and use fewer minerals. Remember the three Rs, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle that contribute to treading more gently?
