

Liturgy Notes and Sources

Notes on our Call to Worship and Prayer of Confession sources are above in the service order. Other liturgy is adapted from, *The Presbyterian Outlook: Worship Liturgy for Sunday, October 26th, 2025* by Rev. Dr. Teri McDowell Ott, Editor of the Presbyterian Outlook

The Affirmation of Faith is from The Second Helvetic Confession, part of our PC(USA) Book of Confessions. The word "Helvetic" is Latin for "Swiss." The setting of the Second Helvetic Confession is Swiss-German Reformed Protestantism... In 1561, Heinrich Bullinger composed the document that later became known as the Second Helvetic Confession.

Westminster welcomes and values children in worship. All kids and their families are welcome to pick up a Children's Worship bag or blue Infant Bag in the Narthex (Sheridan Blvd. foyer). 
