After a fifty-year career as Professor and Chair of the Department of Dental Hygiene at UNMC, Gwen retired and continues to pursue her passion for basket weaving. Her work focuses on traditional Nantucket baskets, known for their solid wood molds, durability, and timeless design. Gwen often adorns her baskets with materials such as ivory, Sanskrit, and lapis lazuli, creating pieces that are both elegant and unique. Though she has been weaving for decades, Gwen has never sold a basket—each one is a labor of love, reflecting her creativity and the friendships she's formed along the way.

Angel Tree

November tips from Presbyterians for Earth Care and Green@Heart: Treading more gently on the Earth with Plant based recipes:

Jen's Candied Pecans

- 2 cups raw pecans or walnuts (or a combo)
- 1 1/2 Tbsp melted coconut oil or olive oil
- 2 Tbsp coconut sugar (plus more for topping)
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 pinch ground nutmeg

- 1/4 tsp sea salt
 2 Tbsp maple syrup (divided)
- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- Add nuts to a bare (or parchment-lined) baking sheet and top with oil, coconut sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg, salt, and 1 Tbsp of the maple syrup. Toss well to coat.
- Bake for a total of 12-15 minutes, or until golden brown and fragrant, tossing/stirring once at the halfway point to ensure even cooking. Then remove from oven and immediately drizzle with remaining 1 Tbsp of maple syrup. I also like to sprinkle on a little more salt, cinnamon, and coconut sugar to coat, but this is optional.
- Stir to combine/coat and enjoy warm or let dry/cool completely on the pan (they'll crisp up as they dry/cool) before storing in an airtight container at room temperature up to 2-3 weeks (or in the freezer up to 1 month).
